Authors are invited to submit presentations on empirical psychotherapy studies both quantitative and qualitative (i.e. case study, grounded theory etc), covering range of theoretical problems, methodological issues, relations between psychotherapy and other sciences, philosophical and cultural topics related to psychotherapy.

Subject matter:

Debate of various psychotherapy models, organisational and cultural conditionings of the psychotherapeutic practice, the future of psychotherapy, the psychotherapy profession, application of the research outcome to the clinical practice, fascinating fields of psychotherapy.

Poster session

Authors are invited to submit posters presenting empirical qualitative psychotherapy studies (i.e. case study, grounded theory etc). Information concerning maximum poster size 100cm x 70cm. During the poster session the participants will choose the best poster which will be honoured with Special Prize of the Polish Association for Integrative Psychotherapy.

Qualification will be based on the submitted abstract. It should contain aim of the study, methods and material, results and conclusions and contain no more than 350 words.

The Organisational Committee reserves the right to revise submissions or the agenda.

Conference Venue

The Conference will take place in Cracow, in International Cultural Centre at 25, Rynek Główny and in the seat of the Polish Association for Integrative Psychotherapy at 6, Pocieszka str.

Why Cracow?

Cracow has traditionally been one of the leading centres of Polish scientific, cultural and artistic life. As the former national capital with a history encompassing more than a thousand years, the city remains the spiritual heart of Poland. It is a major attraction for local and international tourists, attracting seven million visitors annually.



Famous landmarks include the Main Market Square with St. Mary's Basilica and the Sukiennice Cloth Hall, the Wawel Castle, the National Art Museum, the Zygmunt Bell at the Wawel Cathedral, and the medieval St Florian's Gate with the Barbican along the Royal Coronation Route.

In 1978, UNESCO added the historic centre of Cracow, which includes the Old Town, Kazimierz and the Wawel Castle to the list of World Heritage Sites.


